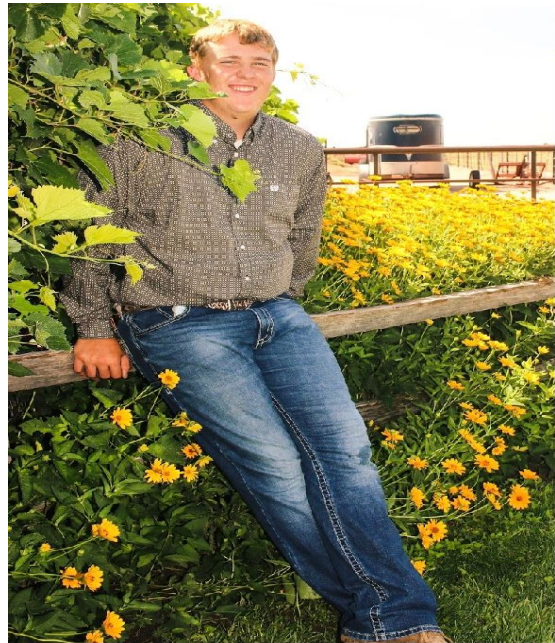
Kade Dutton, is the son of

Austin McCracken is the son of

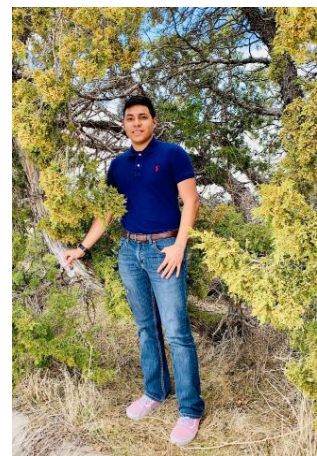
